WELSH CHURCH MUSIC

with

Philip Norman

Last year, based on his five years in Norway, Philip Norman spoke about Norwegian church music. This year, based on just short of five years in Wales, he turns his attention to the music west of Offa's Dyke. Is it all Cwm Rhondda, Blaenwern and chapel, chapel, chapel? Is the Archbishop of Wales a Druid? Are all the services in Cymraeg? Do the Welsh burst out in hymn singing whenever and wherever at the drop of a hat? These questions will be answered and an overall picture of the music at parish and cathedral level will be drawn.

This is a Saesneg's snapshot view of the subject.

*Saesneg = Saxon. That is, English.

In 2025, Pascal attained Fellowship of the Royal College of Organists (FRCO), winning the prizes listed above and the Coventry Cathedral Prize. Additionally, he was Highly Commended at the Northern Ireland International Organ Competition. The previous year, Pascal participated in the Young Talents Class at the Haarlem International Organ Festival, and in December 2024, he was awarded First Prize at the London Organ Competition.

As a composer, Pascal was a winner of the BBC Young Composer Competition in 2023, leading to performances of his works by the BBC Concert Orchestra and the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra. The same year, he received a commission from the Murten Classics Festival, where his music was performed by the Hilaris Chamber Orchestra.

Pascal continues his studies in conducting with Roland Melia and piano with Gareth Owen. Recent performances include Ravel's Piano Concerto in G major with the Brandenburg Sinfonia, and conducting repertoire such as Strauss' Metamorphosen.

Organists Online was set up by Philip Norman in 2000 to help churches, choirs and funeral directors find organists. Although only intended to serve London north of the Thames, successive generations of the site have enabled the service to be rolled out across the world and **there are now over 1,500** Registered organists. There is an untold number of churches, choirs, singers and non-listed organists using the site, which also offers downloadable information about video fees, statistical surveys of fees in general, and serves as a co-ordinating place for a variety of professionally related questions as they are posed. Nothing is charged for using most of **Organists Online's** facilities.

Philip organises music for the North Monmouthshire Ministry Area, a consortium of seventeen parishes near Abergavenny, Wales.

Last year, George Allan spoke to us about *Pipe Up for Pipe Organs* in general. This year, he looks more specifically at the *Sleeping Beauty* project. There's a plan to save six organs in 2026.

The project has four key words: restoration, relocation, reinstallation, and preservation. This presentation can be linked to Presentation 1 as, in the next few years, there's a good chance that up to half of Welsh churches and chapels will close, with the consequent loss of instruments.

Before joining St Pauls', Hamish was organ scholar of St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle. A prizewinning graduate of the Royal Academy of Music, he completed postgraduate study under David Titterington, graduating with Distinction and the coveted DipRAM. Alongside his studies, he served as Organ Scholar of All Saints, Margaret Street, and became a prizewinning Fellow of the Royal College of Organists. Prior to emigrating to the UK in 2022, Hamish completed undergraduate studies at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music.

He maintains an active schedule as a recitalist, with recent appearances at Westminster Abbey and St Alban's Cathedral as part of the International Organ Festival.

PHILIP LUKE

Music in Bloomsbury is generally overseen by Philip Luke. In the church services, flexible musical patterns ensure a wide range of traditional and contemporary musical styles involving singers and instrumentalists of many nationalities.

Philip was born in Pembrokeshire, South Wales, receiving his first organ lessons at Llandaff Cathedral as a teenager. He studied singing at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama before entering London University for organ diplomas and research degrees. As a concert organist, Philip has played at numerous cathedrals including St Paul's, Southwark, Llandaff and St David's, and has participated in various festivals including the City of London. He has toured extensively in the USA and Europe, performing annually in the Czech Republic. In East Anglia - where he is based - Philip has an established reputation as a choral conductor in addition to regular appearances as recitalist at Wymondham Abbey; St Andrew's Hall, Norwich; and the Wymondham Festival.

National Auditorium of Madrid (Bach-Vermut), Notre Dame of Paris, Hallgrímskirkja in Reykjavík, Saint Patrick's Cathedral in New York, Moscow Cathedral, Stavanger concert hall, Berlin Cathedral, Radio France...

She also participates as a jury member in various international competitions and teaches master-classes at multiple international festivals.

In 2015 she published a double CD recorded on the Cavaillé-Coll organ (1863) of the Basilique of Santa María del Coro with works by C. Franck, F. Liszt, J. Brahms and Ch. Tournemire, which received the 4 stars award from "Choir & Organ" Magazine, and was acclaimed by "The Sydney Organ Journal".

In 2017 she brought out another double CD recorded on The Cavaillé-Coll of the Saint Ouen of Rouen Abbey with Louis Robilliard transcriptions acclaimed by the critics (Choir & organ, Resmusica, Journal für die Orgel).

In 2019 another double CD was recorded at the Cathedral of Salamanca and Santanyí (Mallorca) with European Baroque music.

Interested in the pipe organ building process, she has collaborated and participated since 2014 in several works of organ restoration in France and Spain.

She started her studies at the Conservatoire of San Sebastian where she obtained higher degrees in piano, harpsichord, organ and chamber music with Loreto F. Imaz, Esther Mendiburu and Cristina Navajas.

She studied organ at the National Regional Conservatoire of Bayonne with Bernadette Carrau and Esteban Landart, receiving the Gold Medal and the First Prize upon completing the Advanced Degree course.

Entering into the National Higher Conservatoire of Lyon (C.N.S.M.D), she worked with Jean Boyer, Louis Robilliard and J. Von Oortmersen, obtaining the First Prize with "Mention très bien" and her National Diploma of Advanced Studies with specialisation in the organ.

She was awarded scholarships from the local government of Guipuzkoa for two years, as well as from the Lartundo Foundation.

She then furthered her studies over a period of five years at the National Regional Superior Conservatoire in Paris with



Loreto Aramendi is an international concert artist and main organist of the Cavaillé-Coll organ (1863) of the Basilique of Santa María del Coro.

She has given numerous recitals at international festivals in USA, Japan, Canada, Argentina, Chile, Moscow and most of European countries, performing in places like Opera City Hall of Tokyo,

Noelle Spieth, receiving the First Prize upon finalizing her Advanced Degree in the harpsichord and her General Music Studies Diploma. At the same time, she worked with J. Rouvier, on piano specialization.

She studied the piano for three years in Barcelona with Edith Fischer and Jorge Pepi. She has completed advanced courses with professors such as M. Radulescu, J. Oortmersen, W. Jansen, D. Moroney, R. Requejo, Roberto Szidon and Sakharov, amongst others.

She has collaborated with the Basque Symphony Orchestra for many years, with whom she has recorded two discs. She gives concerts as a soloist and as part of different groups as an organist, pianist, and harpsichord player, embracing all periods and styles into her repertoire. At the same time, she has a degree in Psychology from the University of the Basque Country (UPV).

She is currently a professor at the F. Escudero Conservatoire in San Sebastian.

Her future commitments include recitals in Japan, USA, France, Spain, Netherlands, Poland, Italy, Germany, England, Switzerland, Israel, Denmark, Estonia, Serbia, Russia, Luxembourg and Finland.

The Organ in Bloomsbury Central Baptist Church

The present organ was originally built by Brindley & Foster in 1914 at the front of the church. It was rebuilt and moved to the rear gallery by Hill, Norman & Beard in 1964-8. J H Males rebuilt it in 1990. In 2006-8 B C Shepherd & Sons replaced most of the pipes with pipes by J J Binns of Leeds, mainly from Beechen Grove Baptist Church Watford, with a few stops from St Augustine's Tonge Moor, Bolton. Several extra stops were added including a 32ft reed, the Tuba and Vox Humana. At this time John Males refurbished the console, fitting new stop jambs. The tonal work was carried out by John & Eric Shepherd.



Small Choirs Solutions from Scandinavia

The problem of what to do with a choir with few or no men is not one restricted to the UK, nor just to the 20th and 21st centuries. It's obviously been a conundrum which has taxed other nations at other times, so in Norway and Denmark composers were ready with solutions which we could use today.

For instance, in 1820, Hartenack Zinck, in Copenhagen, published:


In the context of this page, the four part settings don't have a lot to offer us but for every chorale there is a two part and a three part version for (more or less) equal voices.

Here are Zinck's two and three part versions of the melody a lot of us sing to *How Brightly Beams the Morning Star*:

In total, there are sixty four of these useful little settings.

In a similar mode, but this time from Norway, are Ludvig Lindeman's settings, published in 1861:

The two part settings are similar in style to those of Zinck, but here is an example of the first phrase of the same melody set for four (more or less) equal voices (first alto/bass is optional):

So what do they offer us today? Well, with a little bit of searching round Google and imslp.org, and a little bit of work with some manuscript paper, you have a large set of easy-to-learn motets for your man-free choir. Even if you have a man or two, they could sing the lower part in their own octave without damaging the harmony.
